New Data on Meth Use to be Released by Montana Office of Public Instruction and Montana Meth Project

HELENA, Mont. — The Montana Office of Public Instruction and the Montana Meth Project will hold a joint press conference on Tuesday, September 18 at the Montana State Capitol to announce key findings from the 2007 Youth Risk Behavior Survey of Montana youth and new Montana and national survey data collected by the Montana Meth Project. The Youth Risk Behavior Survey is conducted every two years by the majority of states in the U.S., with funding provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The data will be simultaneously released at a press conference on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C., hosted by the Montana Congressional delegation, and featuring Meth Project founder and chairman Thomas M. Siebel, and the director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Dr. Julie Gerberding.
